ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Dear audience

Do you remember? A year ago, I announced changes to our concert programmes. Now, these anno<u>unced changes are shapina</u>

up — we are presenting **CLASSICS 180°**. This is the new wording on the front page, and it's intended to be programmatic. Classical music with a new twist — or even turned upside down. Of course, classical works and musicians are still at the centre of our concerts. But things have been added: introductions, discussions, personal perspectives and, last but not least, artistic innovations. Sometimes we're focusing on a single work, sometimes great masters of an era or a country face each other.

Jordi Savall's "Le Concert des Nations" brings Gluck's "Don Juan" to the stage, the first ballet in history to tell a complex story through dance. The Geneva Camerata goes one step further — here, even the orchestra members are involved in the dance. Nicholas Collon and Tom Service explain Stravinsky's "Firebird", the Staatskapelle Dresden approaches the Schumann phenomenon, Alexander Melnikov and the B'Rock Orchestra trace the secret of Beethoven's 1st Piano Concerto. Here are musicians who not only know what they are talking about but can also provide a suitable musical example at any time. Let yourself be surprised!

And because musical enjoyment tastes even better when combined with culinary delights, we have chosen the beginning times of the concerts so that more room can be given to culinary preludes and encores. Treats for all your senses.
